Siddhartha Guntur attends high school at the Gwinnett School of Mathematics, Science, and Technology.


Christopher Huff is a freshman at Capstone Academy.

Alessandro Michael Mendes attends Dekalb School of the Arts.


Mason Turner Smith is a freshman at the Center for Advanced Studies in Science, Math & Technology at Wheeler High School.


What's new at Springmont



Springmont is proud to have had many students as winners and finalists in the 2021 River of Words Poetry and Art Contest! Lower Elementary student Flynn MacQueen's poem, Tiny Turtles, and Lower Elementary student Brielle Cliett's poem, Nature's Love, were both National Poetry Finalists! Upper Elementary student Sophie Little's poem, Hope, and Middle School student Penn Keromytis' untitled poem were Georgia Poetry – State Winners. Upper Elementary student Celeste Beaty's artwork, Spring Fox (pictured here), was a Georgia Art- State Winner!

Congratulations to Team Nebula (Marina Santos, Ellia Meisinger, Mustafa Iqbal and Mason Smith) for placing 3rd in the Georgia Regional Future City competition! The 2020-21 Future City theme was Living on the Moon and required teams to design safe and healthy, futuristic lunar cities. Competition deliverables included a project plan, a 1500-word essay, a scale model built from recycled materials, a presentation video, and a virtual Q&A session with judges.





While Springmont does not believe that standardized testing alone can accurately assess student achievement or measure a student's full potential, tests like the Iowa Assessments taken by Elementary students last January do provide a context for measuring Springmont against the national average as well as other independent and parochial schools. The grey columns represent the national average score or what is considered "grade level" while the blue and orange columns show Springmont's scores in relation. Using English Language Arts as an example, Springmont students scored better than 93% of all students who took the test (NPR) and better than 89% of all students in indepen-

dent and parochial schools (Pri/PR). As you can see, in both cases and across the board, our students are well above grade level. What is even more impressive is that our students' complete composite declined only 2% over previous year whereas other independent and parochial schools that administered the Iowa Assessment saw scores fall by nearly 6%.



While planning, cleaning, and organizing are always a part of Faculty/Staff Workdays, so too is setting aside time for professional growth and development. Over the course of the 2020-21 school year and into this year, workdays included workshops on how racial identity impacts teaching and learning. By investigating our own personal, social, and universal identities, Springmont faculty and

staff took a closer look at how we recognize and challenge unconscious bias and systematic racism in service of all Springmont learners. This important work supports our delivery of the school's mission and core values and provides a framework for instilling a global perspective and respect for diversity of all kinds in our students.
