Dear Springmont Families:

This year has me reflecting deeply on the word impact. What is the impact of a Springmont education on our children? What impact do our graduates have on the world? And what impact do your gifts of time and treasure have on our school community? While we can measure dollars raised and track the number of alumni, the true impact of what our community gives and gets is far greater and harder to quantify.

This fall, a Springmont alumna, now a high school senior, reached out to our Middle School team. She asked to return to campus to make a short film highlighting how Springmont shaped her passion for learning and curiosity about the world — a reflection she planned to include in her college applications. You know what Springmont gives your family, and you gave back in return. Thanks to your generosity, we were able to purchase a new school van, with nearly half of the money raised. Our school "fleet" currently totals three vehicles, which turns out to be a very important number for us. Now, when a group is at the Landschool, we still have a vehicle to use for our cross-country team to get to their meet or for a group of Upper Elementary students to visit a museum for a going out trip. What an impact an additional vehicle has made in a few short months!

Your volunteerism has also made a tremendous impact on our school. Here's just a quick sample: In the media center, it is parents who run our books fairs each year. These volunteers help with promotion, set up and break down of the fair, serve as cashiers, and help students make book selections. Our classroom gardens are brimming with beautiful plants and flowers thanks to the work of our parents. Our animals are fed and cared for every weekend and during breaks thanks to the efforts of our farm friend families. Large- and small-scale maintenance projects were accomplished this year at the Landschool during our annual volunteer Work Weekend!

Our IMPACT is widespread and is getting bigger every year thanks to the support of our Springmont families, past and present. We thank you from the bottom of our hearts!



During my time at Springmont, I've had the joy of watching our school grow from a single building housing the Primary and Elementary programs into an institution rooted in Montessori philosophy educating students from 18 months through Middle School. Although

Later, I also witnessed the expansion of our program to include the Adolescent or Middle School program, as well as the addition of the Landschool campus in Summerville, Georgia. a sense of purpose, gain independence, and deepen their connection to nature during our Landschool visits. This growth and these experiences have been made possible through the generosity of our donors.

Both of our children attended Springmont and thrived under the care of dedicated teachers who gave them the gift of time and attention. Our children, Emilia and George, both began in the Toddler program at just 18 months old, and it was incredible to watch them grow more independent and self-sufficient during those early years.

Today, George is in Upper Elementary, and every day I am amazed by what he learns and the skills he continues to develop. At age six, George was diagnosed with dyslexia, dysgraphia, and ADHD. While he is exceptionally bright, these challenges often make it difficult for him to fully access his potential—like having a treasure chest hidden deep beneath the ocean. Yet, thanks to Springmont's supportive environment and individualized learning approach, George has grown into a confident, curious learner who loves discovering new things. His teachers have helped him find books he enjoys, even though reading is hard for him, and they have guided him in understanding his strengths and weaknesses.



Springmont is more than a school; it is a journey of discovery for every child. It is a place where children learn far beyond academics, growing into thoughtful, capable individuals. REFLECTIONS: ALUMNA CREDITS SPRINGMONT FOR HER STRONG SENSE OF SELF

Aidan Mong, Springmont School Class of 2022

Aidan began her Springmont journey at just two and a half in the Toddler program and graduated from 8th grade — a complete Montessori cycle. Today, she's a high school senior in the highly competitive and rigorous STEM Academy at Walton High School. She's thriving academically and preparing for college with her sights set on attending Washington University in St. Louis as a pre-med major.

Aidan credits Springmont with sparking her love of science. Montessori's approach to hands-on experiences and open-ended inquiry builds confidence and curiosity from an early age. Aidan herself said, "I was doing a science project on cells and hypothesized how the Boggart would have to change and found that I was able to combine my love of science and Harry Potter," she laughs. "Springmont taught me that curiosity fuels discovery and unique viewpoints."

Aidan credits Springmont's Middle School with providing the perfect bridge between Montessori and the demands of high school. "The Middle School is the perfect blend of Montessori and more traditional school," she shares, "it really prepared me for a big high school (like Walton)."

On a recent visit back to campus, Aidan reminisced about her favorite memories — time spent at the Landschool, caring for animals like Pearl the pig and the sugar glider, and the joyful chaos of Field Day. These moments, she says, gave her a sense of belonging and taught her the value of community and stewardship.

Now on the cusp of her next academic chapter, Aidan carries with her the strong foundation built at Springmont, not just in academics, but in independence, empathy, and a lifelong love of learning.



APOGEE

GEORGIA STATE TAX CREDIT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Through our partnership with Apogee Georgia School Choice Scholarship Fund, state taxpayers contribute to the Financial Aid program at Springmont and receive a dollar-for-dollar credit off their Georgia state taxes. Contributions are held in a fund managed by Apogee for Springmont to help eligible students who, otherwise, would not be able to afford full tuition.

This is all part of the Qualified Education Expense Credit Program, which came about in 2008 when Georgia House Bill 1133 (HB1133) was signed into law. The resulting student scholarship organizations (SSOs) allow for Georgia taxpayers: individuals and corporations—to contribute a portion of their state taxes to independent schools of their designation. These SSOs use the contributions to award scholarships to eligible students from K-12 public schools so that they can attend the private schools of their parents' choosing.

Springmont has partnered with Apogee Georgia School Choice Scholarship Fund, a state-approved 501(c)(3) nonprofit SSO, to help us make the best use of this program, but we couldn't do it without the generosity of these donors...THANK YOU!

Springmont School awarded \$505,837.87 in Financial Assistance, providing assistance for nearly 30% of Springmont students.
